MUSIC RULES AND INFORMATION

I Choosing a class

- a) In the case of graded classes you should enter at a grade appropriate to your level of study. Own Choice pieces should be of the same standard as pieces set for a particular class.
- b) Solo Classes. You may only enter once in each class, except for graded classes where you may enter more than once, provided you play a different instrument each time.
- c) Duets, Choirs and Groups: In any competitive class you may not sing in more than one duet or choir, or play in more than one instrumental group. In any non-competitive class you may perform more than once, provided at least one of your partners is different.
- d) Schools Sections 1-5: Schools may not enter more than once in any class other than non-competitive classes. **EXCEPT FOR CLASS 33 WHICH IS FOR GCSE CANDIDATES ONLY.**
- e) No conductor may sing with his or her choir, except in schools classes where a pupil conducts.
- f) For Non-Competitive Classes, adjudicators will give an oral and written adjudication and indicate on each adjudication form the level of performance given. Entrants will receive a certificate.

II Accompanist

- a) You do not have to use the Official Accompanist but it is recommended that you have an efficient accompanist.
- b) If you do intend to use the Official Accompanist, the relevant entry must be made on the entry form and the correct fee paid when submitting the form. However, the Official Accompanist may at his or her discretion accept a direct booking. **A legible and manageable copy of the music must be supplied by the date referred to in the website section "Important Dates".**
- c) It is recommended, but not obligatory, that rehearsals are arranged with the Official Accompanist, who will quote a fee that is payable separately to him or her. Please give good notice, as the Official Accompanist can be very busy before the Festival. Details of the Official Accompanist will be found under "Officials" (see inside back cover).
- d) Pre-recorded accompaniments are not permitted.

IV Own Choice Items

a) These must be specified on the entry form together with the duration of performance; this is essential for accurate timetabling. If Own Choice details are not given on the entry form, the entry will be accepted provided that such details are provided in writing either by post or email (- not by phone – quoting the entrants name, class number and piece(s) in BLOCK CAPITALS by the relevant date referred to in the section "Important Dates". Any entrant who fails to comply with this, or who changes their given piece after the relevant date, will be allowed to perform, and will receive an adjudication and a category, but will not be placed in the class.

Please do NOT send copies of music at this stage – only titles etc. (see Important Dates)

- b) Please do not repeat any own choice used in the previous year. No person may perform the same piece in more than one class.
- d) Entrants are responsible for the suitability of their own choice pieces.
- e) Where necessary, songs may be transposed to a key more suitable for the performer's voice.
- f) Unless otherwise stated, one song or piece does not include two movements of the same piece or a medley.

V Music for Adjudicators

a) Legible and complete copies of all materials must be handed to the adjudicator's clerk prior to performance, except in the case of set pieces.

VI Music Copies

- a) Entrants must not perform from photocopies – however, copies provided for the adjudicator may be photocopies – see Rule 5, p.vii
- b) Please label any original copies you bring to the Festival with your name, otherwise we will not be able to return any that are left behind.

VII TIME LIMITS

- a) **Please observe all time limits for performances. If you do not keep to the time limit you may be stopped and may not be placed.**
- b) Entrants are welcome to introduce their chosen piece, but please note that this will form part of the overall performance time, as will any accompaniment. These MUST be included when timing the performance.
